ART: BOOK ON GYMNASTICS BY LEGENDARY GYMNASTICS COACH M. D. GURJAR

Mr. M. D. Gurjar S/O Late Dharnidhar Gurjar was born on 11.01.1935 at Pune, Maharashtra and Passed 1st Adhoc diploma course in gymnastics in 1961 from NIS Patiala with 100% along with 1960's top gymnasts of India such as Mr. V. B. Pillai, Mr. Sham Lal Khullar, Mr. Gandamal Sharma, Mr. Debashish Mondal, Mr. Trilok Singh, Mr. Dalip Singh, Mr. Anantram, Mr. Pritam Singh and Mr. Massa Singh. Later, Mr. Sham Lal Khullar (1956), Mr. Anantram (1956 & 1964), Mr. Pritam Singh (1956), Mr. Debashish Mondal (1964) and Mr. Trilok Singh (1964) represented India in Melbourne (1956) and Tokyo (1964) Olympic Games. He joined National Institute of Sports (NIS) as a coach on 1.11.1962 and retired in 1993 after serving the organization for 31 years.




Mr. Gurjar dedicated his precious years of retired life to establish Krida Prabodhini at Pune and later in the whole Maharashtra. Krida Prabodhini is a residential scheme of Government of Maharashtra is now located in all the district of Maharashtra and caters the young sports persons between 8-14 years of age in all the Olympic Sports disciplines.

Mr. Moreshwar Dharnidhar Gurjar participated in the XVII National Games held at Patiala in 1956. He represented Pune University in All India Inter-University Gymnastics Championships and won many Individual medals. He was the member of Technical Committee in gymnastics at National, Asian and International levels and involved in officiating at National and International level for last eight decades. He was the author of the renowned book "Gymnastics" which was written on the request of Central Advisory Board of Physical Education. He was also the author of the Handbook i. e. Shikshan-Hastpustika-Gymnastics for the curriculum of secondary and higher secondary, government of Maharashtra. Recently, one more book on Gymnastics in Marathi is written by him for the benefit of Maharashtra Gymnastics.



Mr. M. D. Gurjar conducted many National Coaching Camps during 1975-1984 in preparation of Indian teams for various international tournaments. He was the coach of Indian teams, which participated in National Games at Islamabad, Pakistan in 1980, IX Asian Games New Delhi 1982 and China 1982. He also wrote many articles on gymnastics, which are beneficial to the budding gymnasts and school going students. He produced many national champions and gymnasts of international repute such as Jayshree Bapat, Savita Joshi, Sanjivini Karandikar who participated in IX Asian Games New Delhi 1982, CWG Brisbane 1982, China 1982 & Moscow News 1983 and Mukta Bhide in IX Asian Games New Delhi in 1982, Ajit Jarande in World Artistic Gymnastics Championship at Birmingham (UK) 1993 while Medha Bapat and Vidyut Bhagwat attended till the last national coaching camps for IX Asian Games New Delhi 1982. All the above gymnasts are bestowed Maharashtra State's highest Sports **"Shiv Chhatrapati Award"** in different years.


Mr. M. D. Gurjar, who is known as **"Father of Gymnastics"** in Maharashtra, was honoured by Government of Maharashtra with the most prestigious **"Dadaji Konddeo Award"** in 1991-92 for his valuable contributions in Gymnastics for the State of Maharashtra and as a



whole for the country. Presently, he is 83 years old with good health and spent most of his time in reading and writing articles on gymnastics and still keeps himself update with the latest knowledge and information of World of Gymnastics. He was the renowned column writer for Regional and National leading News Papers i. e. YOG: 3RD YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA 2018

2018 Summer Youth Olympic Games officially known as the III Summer Youth Olympic Games, and commonly known as Buenos Aires 2018, were an international sports, cultural, and educational event held in Buenos Aires, Argentina between 6 and 18 October



2018. They were the first Summer Youth Olympic Games held outside of Asia and the first Youth Games for either summer or winter held outside Eurasia. It was the second Olympic Games held in

South America after the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. On 13 February 2013, the IOC selected Buenos Aires as one of the three Candidate Cities for the 2018 Summer Youth Olympic Games out of the six bids. 3997 athletes from 206 nations participated in 3rd Youth Olympic Games for 239 events in 32 sports. These games officially inaugurated by Shri Mauricio Macri President of Argentina at Parque Polideportivo Roca stadium on 6th October 2018. 46 athletes from India participated in 13 sports i. e. Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Boxing, Field Hockey, Judo, Rowing, Shooting, Sports Climbing, Swimming, Table Tennis, Weight-lifting and Wrestling with 36 events and managed their best ever medal haul of 13 medals i.



e. 3 gold, 9 silver and 1 bronze medal of the Youth Olympics in this edition. India's 13 medals are from Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Field Hockey, Judo, Shooting, Weight-Lifting, and Wrestling which is a stupendous show of Indian athletes. India was ranked 17th on the medals tally in 2018 Summer Youth Olympics among the 206 nations. India ranked 58th with 6 silver and 2 bronze medals in 1st YOG in Singapore in 2010 and ranked 64th with 1 silver and 1 bronze medal in 2nd YOG in Nanjing, China in 2014. India didn't participate in Gymnastics. Manu Bhaker was the flag bearer in the opening ceremony while Jeremy Lalrinnunga in the closing ceremony. Gold medals for India are won by the following athletes i. e. 1. Jeremy Lalrinnunga won India's first ever Youth Olympics Gold medal, 2. Tababi Devi won the first ever youth Olympics medal for India in Judo and later also won a silver in the mixed team event under mixed-NOC, 3. Manu Bhaker became the first Indian girl to win a Youth Olympics Gold medal. Indian Olympic Association (IOA) Felicitated the Youth Olympic Games medal winners with a cash prize of Rs. 3 lakh for gold, 1.5 lakh for silver and 1 lakh for bronze respectively at Ashok Hotel on 21st October 2018 in presence of Union Sports Minister Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore, Minister of State Home Kiran Rijju and Sports Secretary Rahul Bhatnagar. Felicitation function also took place at the PM's residence on 21st October 2018 in the morning in honour of the 13 Indian medal winners in the 3rd edition of Youth Olympic Games 2018.

Gymnastics, to enhance cooperation, communication and good relationship between coaches from different countries of Asian Continent. ART: TRIBUTE TO 1964 OLYMPIAN BHIKAJI BHONSLE

1964 Olympian Legendary Gymnast Bhikaji Bhonsle S/O Late Govindrao Bhonsle left for his heavenly abode after a long sickness on 22nd October 2018 morning at his native village Tisangi, Taluka Khed of Maharashtra at the age of 76 years. MAGA expresses deep condolence on the sad demise of All Time Gymnastics Champion Late Bhikaji Bhonsle and share the sorrow of bereaved family of Legendary Gymnast.



Late Bhikaji Bhonsle started his gymnastics career by joining Indian Army (boys) at the age of 14 years and posted at 104 Engineering Regiment Alwar, Rajasthan on 5.8.1957 than transferred to BEG Pune after 2 years training in 1959. Mr. Bhikaji was inspired for gymnastics by Col. Braganza Commandant BEG and Col. Fonseca Commandant ASPT (Now AIPT) and started gymnastics training under Subedar R. S. Thapa at ASPT Pune in 1959. He first time played for services gymnastics team in the 7th Junior National Gymnastics Championship at Patiala in 1961 and was declared as All Round Individual

Champion. Mr. Bhikaji Bhonsle represented SSCB in Senior National Championships from 1963 to 1967 and declared All Round Individual Champion continuously in all the above championships and won 28 gold and 8 silver medals in the Senior National Gymnastics Championships. He also completed the 2nd Adhoc Course in Gymnastics Coaching under foreign experts at National Institute of Sports Patiala in 1961 along with Late D. K. Tondan and Mr. Patang Mohite.

Late Bhikaji Bhonsle He competed at Tashkent Russia (Now Uzbekistan) in 1962 under cultural exchange programme along with Late Dalip Singh (Father of Gymnastics, Tripura), Tarlok Singh, Late Debashish Mondal, Ranjit Singh, Kripal Singh, Ram Dutt, Bachan Singh, Satya Narayan, Sarbir Singh and Anant Ram and



secured 1st place in Floor with 9.85. Late Bhikaji Bhonsle represented India first time in the Olympic Games at Tokyo, Japan in 1964 along with Anant Ram, Late Debashish Mondal, Trilok Singh, Yashwant More, Vithal Karande and Late Rameshwar Dayal as Manager and the than President GFI. Late Bhikaji was also the member of the Indian team along with Dilip Ojha (Ring Champion from WB), Bhagwan Singh, Parbhati Ram, Vithal Karande, Bachan Singh and Kripal Singh which competed against in West German Gymnastics Team at New Delhi on 16th & 17th September 1967 under the cultural exchange programme and won gold medal in Pommel Horse. Late Bhikaji Bhonsle fell down from Horizontal Bar in the 12th Senior National Gymnastics Championship at Agartala, Tripura in 1967 and got injury in neck and lumber region and was suffering with the same injury till his last days of life. Late Bhikaji Bhonsle was promoted as Naik in 1961, as Havaldar in 1963, as Naib-Subedar in 1964, as Subedar in 1967 and Subedar Major in 1970 and finally promoted as Honorary Captain in 1986. He was retired in 1987 after serving the Indian Army with dignity and sincerity for 30 years and brought laurel to the country. We, the gymnastics fraternity of India salute to this Great Gymnast for his achievements and glory to the country.

He represented the state of Maharashtra for maximum number of years in National Gymnastics Championships. Late Shri Vasant Asawale played a key role in the organization and administration at many District, State and National Championships. He was one of the technical official in IX Asian Games at Delhi in 1982 and XXVIII National Games at Pune in 1993. Late Shri Vasant Asawale shared his valuable knowledge of Gymnastics with the upcoming gymnasts of yester-years at Maharashtra Mondal Tilak Road Pune and produced many gymnasts of National Repute such as Gauri Jog, Mansi Gondhalekar, Pooja Patki, Teja Limaye, Gayatri Ghanekar, Aarti Aghase, Nupoor Dolare and many more. He was attached to impart coaching till the end of his life. Late Mr. Asawale was very hard working and dedicated coach whose services will be remembered

A total of 7 Countries who are the champions of FIG Acrobatic Gymnastics World Championship held at Belgium on Apr 2018 participated in the subject championship (Azerbaijan, Belarus, India, Israel, Kazakhstan, Russia and Ukraine).



India team was selected on the basis of the merit list of 11th Acrobatic Senior National Championship held at Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala from 1 – 3 Sep 2018. An India camp was organized by the Gymnastics Association, Haryana under the aegis of Gymnastics Federation of India from 12 Oct – 14 Nov 2018 in which 21 gymnasts from Maharashtra, Haryana, West Bengal and SSCB took part. Mr. Sumith MR from SSCB, Mr. Purushottam Darwankar and Mr. Pravin Shinde from Maharashtra were the Coaches for the subject Competition. This was the first time GFI sending Acrobatics Gymnastics team in a World cup and create a history in Indian Acrobatic Gymnastics by winning Bronze medal in Men's Groups 1 (Siddesh Bhosle, Aris Prince, Hrishikesh More, Rajilesh



Sureshbabu of SSCB) the country's first ever World Cup medal in Acrobatic Gymnastics in its first ever World Cup Competition followed by our Men's Group 2 (Sawan, Nitesh, Rohit and Sameer Nagpal of Haryana) secured 4th Position, however our Women's Trio (Ayushi Ghodeswar, Prachi Parkhi and Mrunmayi Walde of Maharashtra) finished third, although no medals were awarded due to an

insufficient number of participating groups. In Mix pair 1 of India (Avijit Debnath and Tinku Sarkar of West Bengal) ranked 10th position and given the Media sympathy award for their performance. In Mix Pair 2 (Dr. Naveen Kumar and Ankita of Haryana) ranked 9th position stood first in Indian Mix Pair and Mix Pair 3 (Jyoti Ravan Shinde and Kunal Ramchandra Kothekar of Maharashtra) ranked 11th position. Indian contingent consists of Dipa Karmakar, B. Aruna Reddy in WAG, Ashish Kumar and Rakesh Kumar Patra in MAG along with their coaches Mr. B. S. Nandi (Dronacharya Awardee) in WG, Mr. Manoj Rana and Mr. B. I. Bayaskar in MAG participated in FIG Individual Apparatus World Cup at Cottbus, Germany from 22-25th November 2018. Mr. Deepak Kabra FIG International Judge was with Indian Team to evaluate the performance at the FIG Individual Apparatus World Cup at Cottbus, Germany. On the first day, Dipa Karmakar qualified on Table Vault with an average score of 14.100 points at 6th place out of 15 gymnasts but B Aruna Reddy scored 13.000 points on Table Vault and suffered a knee injury to end her campaign in disappointment at the Cottbus World Cup. The young Tripura girl Dipa Karmakar won an amazing Bronze medal on Table Vault with an average score of 14.3.16 points in a very tough final on the third day of the championship, who had an injury marred campaign at Asian Games 2018. FIG Individual Apparatus World Cup was the part of an eight event qualifying system for 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games under which gymnasts will make the cut based on top three scores. Earlier, Dipa also won a Gold medal in Table Vault at FIG Artistic Gymnastics World Challenge Cup at Mersin, Turkey in July 2018 for her first medal after returning to action following a long layoff of 2 years. Ashish Kumar scored 13.200 points in Floor Exercises with not a good execution and was placed 24th out of 37 gymnasts and scored 12.866 points in Table Vault with a ranking of 23rd out of 27 gymnasts. Rakesh Kumar Patra also performed one of the best routine scored



14.000 points on Rings and placed 14th out of 29 gymnasts on the first day of the competition and scored 13.033 points on Parallel Bars with a ranking of 16th out of 29 gymnasts on the second day of the FIG Individual Apparatus World Cup at Cottbus, Germany.
